Aziza Shad, MD, Director, Georgetown University Division of Pediatric Hematology/ Oncology Blood & Marrow Transplantation, Lombardi Cancer Center. Her work in pediatric cancer research and clinical treatment spans over 25 years and several continents. In 2003, she founded the Pediatric Cancer Survivorship Clinic at Georgetown. As Director of the International Network for Cancer Treatment and Research USA, she works to improve cancer survival rates of children in Africa, the Middle East, Asia and Latin America, educating oncologists and nurses, and establishing pediatric palliative care. Dr. Shad is consistently listed one of Washingtonian Magazine 'Top Docs' and has received the 2007 GRAVITAS Award for Outstanding Humanitarian Work.

Kate Shafer, MSW, LICSW, Patient Navigator, George Washington Cancer Institute, Thriving After Cancer program for adult survivors of childhood cancer. She is a licensed clinical social worker with more than 20 years experience in pediatric oncology, patient advocacy, and legislative affairs.
