Oncology Blood & Marrow Transplantation, Lombardi Cancer Center. Her work in
pediatric cancer research and clinical treatment spans over 25 years and several
continents. She founded Pediatric Cancer Survivorship, Palliative Care, and Nutrition
Programs at Georgetown, and is past president of the International Network for Cancer
Treatment and Research USA. She works to improve cancer survival rates of children in
Africa, the Middle East, Asia and Latin America, educating clinicians, and establishing
pediatric palliative care. Dr. Shad is consistently listed one of Washingtonian Magazine
'Top Docs', is a frequent speaker at scientific meetings, widely published, and has
received dozens of awards and honors.

Steven Hardy, PhD, Psychologist, Divisions of Hematology, Oncology, and Blood and Marrow Transplantation, Children's National Medical Center & Ass't Professor of Psychiatry/Behavioral Sciences, GW University School of Medicine & Health Sciences. Dr. Hardy provides psychological assessments & treatment for children with cancer. sickle cell disease, and other blood disorders, as well as those undergoing bone marrow transplants in the acute setting and as part of multidisciplinary clinics for survivors.
